Lynne-single, youngest of the participants, eager to please, nail bitter, a nurse in-training

Andy – married, always wears long sleeves, has a son in boarding school

Maxine —married, an opportunist business owner, flamboyant, Maxine The Mouth, step-mom in 2nd marriage

Geoffrey – widowed, doesn't like to be noticed and most of the time wouldn't be, carries a rucksack (a bonus if actor can also play a bit of boogie-woogie on the piano), sells shipping insurance and has a son who works abroad
